Education Programme launched

At its October meeting the Board of General Purpose agreed to the adoption of a District Education Programme, which had been developed over the past few months by W.Bro John Finney, W.Bro Dave Hubbard of Agapinor Lodge and Bro Ian McLean, the District Webmaster. W.Bro John Finney has been appointed the District Education Officer and his first task will be to encourage each Lodge to appoint a Lodge Education Officer. He and the team will be holding a meeting early in the New Year with those Brethren appointed as Lodge Education Officers, when they will be outlining the role the LEO's can play in promoting education within their Lodges.

It should be stressed that the adoption of the Education Programme is not mandatory; Lodges are obviously free to choose how to educate their new Masons. However, the Board does feel that a structured District Education Programme would be more beneficial and productive and is urging Lodges to adopt the programme.

Make YOUR daily advancement in Masonry

In Lodge you will see some Brethren wearing a gold-coloured breast jewel in the shape of the Star of David. The jewel will be suspended from either a white ribbon, a crimson ribbon or a tri-coloured ribbon. This is the jewel of the **Royal Arch Chapter** and is presented on a white ribbon to a Brother when he becomes a Companion of the Order. When a Royal Arch Mason becomes one of the Three Principals of his Royal Arch Chapter the ribbon changes from white to crimson. If a Brother is a present or past District, Provincial or Grand Officer, or a holder of Metropolitan, London or Overseas Grand Rank in the Royal Arch Order the ribbon is tri-coloured - dark blue, crimson and light blue. In the District of Cyprus it is the policy for present or past District Officers and Grand Officers to wear only the Royal Arch Chapter jewel in Lodge.
