'Elect' - is there a link?

Last November the American people made their choice and they now have a new President. After his election he became known as the 'President Elect' until his inauguration on 20th January. The term 'Elect' is one with which we are familiar; each year every Lodge appoints a Worshipful Master who is then known as the Master Elect until his investment. Is the American use of the word simply coincidence or does it have a Masonic connection? After all, a number of the signatories to the Declaration of Independence were Freemasons. In fact the first President, George Washington, was one of them, and had to borrow a bible from a local Masonic lodge on which to take his oath of allegiance. The same bible has been used on a number of other Presidential inaugurations, probably by Presidents who were Freemasons. It is known that at least 15 of them were Freemasons, including Andrew Jackson, Theodore Roosevelt, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, Lyndon B. Johnson and Gerald Ford. George W. Bush Sr also took his oath on this bible although he is not a Freemason. Food for thought, perhaps!

Rumours are abound on the internet that the new President is a Mason, but no positive links have been found that identify him with the Craft. He did, in fact, take his oath of allegiance on a bible used by Abraham Lincoln, whom he admires.

Make YOUR daily advancement in Masonry



You may have noticed some brethren wearing a small, blue lapel pin in the shape of a flower. The origin of this is that during the Nazi reign in Germany, Freemasonry was outlawed so a symbol was sought by which brethren could recognise each other. The simple Forget-Me-Not was chosen and the wearing of it in one's lapel would signal to other Freemason's that you were a brother. At the end of the Second World War, the Grand Lodge of Germany reconvened, and announced that the Forget-Me-Not would remain as a symbol by which German brethren would recognise each other, and also to be worn in memory of those brave brethren who continued to practice Freemasonry against these odds, and had lost their lives. In later years the Forget-Me-Not was adopted by Freemasonry in general as a symbol that despite the great oppression, adversity and evil faced during those dark years, the light of Freemasonry was not extinguished. In some Lodges, a newly-raised Master Mason is presented with one by his proposer as a symbol of eternal friendship and as a reminder that the

light of Freemasonry will continue to shine through all adversity.
