Address by the District Grand Master

“Distinguished Visitors and Brethren, it gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to the 32nd Annual Communication of the District Grand Lodge of Cyprus. It is a special occasion today, as we have the Grand Secretary, V.W.Bro. Nigel Brown visiting us; whom I will invite to say a few words to you later. Also we are honoured by the Deputy Grand Master of Greece, R.W.Bro. Vassilogeorgis. I am confident that they will enjoy the warmth of our hospitality.

This year has seen the growth of the District with two Lodges being Consecrated. Allegoria, and just recently Lakeside, and I welcome both these new Lodges to the District. I hope that they will contribute to the growth of Freemasonry in the District of Cyprus.

I am delighted to say that Grand Lodge is extremely pleased with the running of the District. If not, then the Grand Secretary will soon let us know! We continued this past year in the same financial situation as before. I do not need to remind you that we must keep a constant watch on our Lodge expenses, but even more on the welfare of those Brethren less fortunate.

The Mentor scheme, set up by Grand Lodge, is now operational in nearly all our Lodges. You will be hearing

a lot more about this in the coming year. Brethren, the office of a Lodge Mentor is important and I have asked W.Bro. Rob Cowin to oversee it on behalf of the District. I would like to thank all those who have assisted in raising funds for the District Charities. I would now like to see the same effort put into raising funds for the Masonic Samaritan Fund to enable us to make a worthwhile contribution on behalf of the Lodges and the District. Once again we were fortunate in having the Band of the Royal Air Force to play at a Concert in Paphos. This year we will be able to hold another Concert, which will be on the 9th June at the same venue. Our thanks go to W.Bro. Roy Newman for his considerable efforts in making the last Concert a great success; as well as those members of Agapinor and Dionysos Lodges for their support and assistance. I think we had more publicity than ever before the Concert, and it showed in the numbers attending. I am sure, Brethren, you will support W.Bro. William Mills in this year’s event. Remember Brethren, this is the biggest fund raiser for Charity in the District, and without it we could not support the local charities as we do.

I would like to thank W.Bro. Leandros Zachariades, as President of the Board of General Purposes, and his Committee for their recommendations and advice over the past year. He has conducted the Committee meetings very ably and a considerable amount of business has been transacted.

Again, I have been very well served by those acting officers appointed for the year. My thanks go to my Deputy, V.W.Bro. Eric Williams and my Assistant, W.Bro. Andrew Theocharous, for their support and I take this opportunity to thank all the District Officers for the manner in which they have supported both me and the District of Cyprus in the past twelve months. To all those I have invested or re-appointed this year, I look forward to working with you in the coming year. Appointment and promotion to District rank is a sign of the efforts you have put into Freemasonry in the Lodges and District; please continue to do so. I look forward to another year and hope that it will prove interesting and beneficial to all.”

Summary of Address by the Grand Secretary

The Grand Secretary thanked the District for its kind invitation and congratulated the District Grand Master on the turnout for the Communication. He was particularly pleased that the Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Greece was in attendance.

He stated that these were interesting and exciting times for Freemasonry and that Grand Lodge was working very hard to ensure the continued future of Freemasonry. To this end he mentioned:

- The 300th Anniversary of Grand Lodge in 2017, which will be the greatest celebration of Freemasonry ever known! Both Provinces and Districts will be involved in the celebrations

- Communication with regard to Freemasonry – i.e. the need to communicate freely with family and friends and talk openly about Freemasonry. Issues such as: What is Freemasonry? What is it about and how should we respond to these questions by highlighting integrity, fairness and tolerance

- Similarly looking at queries from the media and press – we must remove the “myths” to ensure Freemasonry is not viewed negatively.

- The role of the District Mentor is a step in the right direction – helping new initiates and encouraging talking to friends and family

He stressed the importance of bringing quality candidates into Freemasonry and stressed that we should enjoy our Freemasonry

He concluded by saying “well done, nice to meet you all and that he was very proud of the District of Cyprus. Keep it up”.

Summary of Address by the Deputy Grand Master of Greece

R.W.Bro. Vassilogeorgis extended greetings from the Grand Master of Greece. He reiterated the Grand Secretary’s words concerning openness in Freemasonry and said that society needs to get to know us by the example we set, which is what is being attempted in Greece. He extended his personal best wishes to both the Grand Secretary and to the District Grand Master and to the District of Cyprus.

He then presented the District Grand Master with a copy of the emblem of the Grand Lodge of Greece and thanked the District Grand Master for the invitation and for the hospitality received.

The District Grand Master thanked the Deputy Grand Master of Greece and informed him that the gift would be placed at the District Office.

District Grand Chapter

The Annual Convocation of the District Grand Chapter was held prior to the Annual Communication when the District Grand Chapter Officers were invested by the Grand Superintendent who gave the following address:

“Companions, I have much pleasure in welcoming you all to this our Sixteenth Annual Convocation of the District of Cyprus. I am very encouraged by the number of Companions present today. It is a great pleasure to have with us today E.Comp. Nigel Brown the Grand Scribe E from Supreme Grand Chapter who will address our meeting later this afternoon. I extend a very warm

welcome to our visitors and hope that they have a very enjoyable stay with us.

I congratulate the Companions I have invested this afternoon and I wish them a very enjoyable year. Honours are earned and are not only for the work you have already done in the District or your Chapter but are recognition for the continuation of the work in the future and I look forward to seeing you at our Chapter meetings.

I am very pleased with the number of new Exaltees which most of the Chapters have been able to attract with a number of Chapters performing double ceremonies. I trust that now we have a representative in each Craft Lodge this pattern will continue, as it is important that the Brethren take the next step in Antient Freemasonry by joining the Royal Arch.

There are many Royal Arch Companions who reside in our District, who are members of one of our Craft Lodges, who are Royal Arch Companions, but have not as yet joined a Chapter in the District. I urge you to encourage them to join a Chapter in the District so that they may continue to enjoy this beautiful degree.

In accordance with Grand Chapter recommendations we should encourage more participation in our ceremonies by sharing the work where appropriate, especially the Principal Sojourners work and the Lectures. I would again request all Principals to join Cyprus Principals’ Chapter to share their experiences with like minded Companions. This Chapter was consecrated to encourage discussion and to learn more about the Holy Royal Arch and we are looking into ways of making the meetings more interesting.

All Chapters in the District have been visited by myself or my Deputy together with the District Grand Principals and other District Officers. These visits have proved to be very useful and the reception received from the Companions was most encouraging.

I am pleased to hear that the Administration of the District is running smoothly and I thank my District Grand Scribe E and all Chapter Scribe E’s for their continued support in this respect.

My Deputy, E.Comp. Eric Williams has made a number of visits during the year both Official and Unofficial and I thank him for his support.

E.Comp. Rob Cowin, President of the Committee of General Purposes, has carried out his duties in an excellent manner and I also thank him.

I would also like to thank E.Comp. Andreas Vorkas for his support during his period of office as Second District Grand Principal and I am looking forward to working with his successor E.Comp. Gerry Goldsack, who as you know has been the District Grand Scribe E for the past five years.

The Acting District Officers during the year have visited the Chapters and discharged their responsibilities in an exemplary manor and I wish to record my thanks for their support to myself and the District. Companions I am sure that we shall all continue to enjoy our Royal

Arch Masonry during the coming year and I urge you to continue to support your Chapters.

I have been approached by many of our Greek speaking Companions to consecrate a new Chapter which will work in the Greek language. This Chapter would be attached to Allegoria Lodge and would meet in the John Percy White Temple in Limassol. I have asked my Deputy to speak with the Companions to ascertain the numbers interested in becoming Founder members.

Companions enjoy the rest of the day and I hope that I will see many of you at the Festive Board this evening. Thank you."

Meet W.Bro. Bob Humphries, District Grand Secretary

W.Bro. Bob Humphries was born in Broseley, Shropshire, in 1946. Following school he joined the Army as a Junior Leader in May 1961. He spent 40 years in the Army serving in Malaya, Australia, Mauritius, Cyprus, Germany, Northern Ireland (where he did 13 operational tours) and the UK. He retired from the Army in February 2001 as a Major but has not completely cut his links with the military as he now undertakes voluntary work in Episkopi Station as Events Coordinator for the various events provided for the Military serving there.



Bob was first introduced into Freemasonry by W.Bro. Rob Cowin PGJD, PDepDistGM in 2000 and was Initiated in Apollo

Lodge on 11th April 2000. In 2001 he was invited to take on the position of Chief Steward of the Lodge and in 2004 he was made Senior Deacon, becoming the Master in January 2006.

In January 2007, Bob was offered the office of Secretary of the Lodge which he gladly accepted. In May of that year he was appointed District Assistant Grand Secretary by the District Grand Master. January 2011 saw Bob give up the reins as Secretary of Apollo Lodge and in May this year he was appointed District Grand Secretary.

The District Grand Lodge of Cyprus sponsored the ninth "Annual Charity Band Concert" which was held on Saturday 9th June in Paphos Castle Square in front of an audience of 1450. The Band of the Royal Air Force College, Cranwell, England, directed by its Musical Director, Squadron Leader Chris Weldon and Bandmaster Warrant Officer Gary Stevens displayed their talents with a varied programme of classic military band music, coupled with "Sing Sing Swing" musical & vocal pieces, which proved most popular with the audience. In addition, the trumpeters played from the battlements of the Castle Keep during



the Evening Hymn & Sunset. The event culminated in the playing and community singing of Pomp & Circumstance No. 1 and for closure The Royal Air Force



March Past.

The Royal Air Force Bands have a long tradition of playing to audiences in Cyprus, having been present on the island over many years, freely giving their time for charitable causes. Likewise, there is a long and close association with the District Grand Lodge of Cyprus. Apart from visiting Cyprus, the band has visited Canada, Germany, Gibraltar, Hong Kong, USA, Falkland Islands, Poland, Hungary and Israel. We look forward, with hope, to another visit in 2013.

These yearly charitable band concerts are the single largest charity drive of the Cyprus Masonic year. Last year the band concert raised €12,000. Part was presented to "The Alzheimer's Association" and part to "The Cyprus Anti-Cancer Society". During the concert a cheque for €1,000 was presented to Mr. Tom Handley, Chairman of the Paphos Support Group and Dr Maria Stuttaford of the Akrotiri Support Group by the District Grand Master (adjacent picture).

Are you up to date?

Installation Night at a Provincial Lodge

I made a visit to a Lodge last year

It was their Installation.

The Secretary spoke loud and clear

When he read the Regulations.

But as we listened to those Charges.

They were not quite as intended

Because the book he used that night.

Had never been amended!!

Ancient Charge No. 11:

Before 1986/87 the Charge read:

You admit that it is not in the power of any Man or Body of Men to make innovation in the Body of Masonry.

From 1986 /87 it reads:

*You admit that it is not in the power of any Man or Body of Men to make any **Alteration or Innovation in the Body of Masonry without the consent first obtained of the Grand Lodge.***

Immediate Past Master:

At a Provincial Lodge Installation Meeting the Director of Ceremonies requested the following: "*Worshipful Master the Immediate Past Master is unfortunately absent this evening, is it your wish to Invest him at a later Meeting?*" The Worshipful Master replied that it was.

Unfortunately this is incorrect. If the Immediate Past Master is absent on Installation night he cannot be invested at a later date. He will, at the next Meeting he attends, be allowed to wear his Past Masters Collar. This is a ruling contained within the little booklet that is issued with every new copy of the Book of Constitutions and is entitled "*Information for the Guidance of Members of the Craft*", the latest edition being 2011 (see page 11 / 12 Board of Installed Masters, Definition of)

It is therefore important that we all keep our Books of Constitutions and the booklet "*Information for the Guidance of Members of the Craft*" up to date or better still buy a new one every two years. Since the formation of the United Grand Lodge of England in 1813 there have been 38 publications of the Book of Constitutions, the latest edition being 2012.

Did you know that the Emulation Ritual Book is also regularly updated and the latest amended version is the 12th edition. For Taylor's Working the latest edition is the 3rd Edition 1991 (with extended Rubric 4th Edition 2000). Have you got yours?

As the Lodge Director of Ceremonies you see four Brothers sitting together, they are all wearing Installed Masters Aprons, but no Collars. Only one is the current Master of a Lodge, so who are the other three? Answer in the next "From our own DGDC".

The Future of Freemasonry

"The Future of Freemasonry" report is the first ever independent study conducted by a non-Masonic body and was commissioned as part of the build-up to the United Grand Lodge of England's tercentenary in 2017. Produced by the highly respected Social Issues Research Centre (SIRC), an independent, non-profit organisation based in Oxford, which conducts research on social and lifestyle issues, socio-cultural trends and provides insight into human behaviour and social relations, the report suggests that, contrary to some misleading commentary, Freemasonry actually demonstrates genuine openness and transparency and it concludes that it is arguably more relevant today than ever before. The 3rd Earl Kitchener of Khartoum DL, TD

R.W.Bro. Earl Kitchener, who was an Honorary Member of Lord Kitchener Lodge No. 3402, was Called to the Grand Lodge Above on 16 December 2011 aged 92. Major Henry Herbert Kitchener, 3rd Earl Kitchener DL, TD, was born on 24th February 1919 and was the son of Captain Henry Franklin Chevallier Kitchener, Viscount Broome, the only son of Henry Kitchener, 2nd Earl Kitchener. His great-uncle was the renowned military commander Herbert Kitchener, 1st Earl Kitchener. With his death, and to his profound regret, the title "Earl Kitchener" dies.

We are also very grateful to W.Bro. Redvers for forwarding the accompanying historical document dated 23rd October 1913 on the Dedication of the Masonic Temple in the District Grand Lodge of Egypt and the Sudan in which is an early description of Lord Kitchener Lodge.



MEMORIAL

HISTORY OF LORD KITCHENER LODGE No. 3402.

(Supplied by Wor. Bro. Tucker).

This lodge was formed to meet exceptional requirements of Military and Naval Brethren in Egypt in 1909.

A Lodge called the "United Service" existed in the Egyptian Constitution, but Lodges working under this banner existed only in Egypt. Thus a service-brother had to join another constitution on leaving Egypt if he wished to keep up his Masonic connection. Moreover any Masonic rank that he might have obtained would not be recognised by an English, Irish or Scotch Lodge.

These reasons were mainly the cause of a number of Military Brethren presenting a Petition for the foundation of a Service Lodge under the English Constitution to be called the "Lord Kitchener" Lodge.

On the recommendation of the District Grand Master the Warrant was issued.

The Lodge was consecrated by Wor. Bro. Langley D.D.G.M. on the 17th Nov. 1909. Worshipful Bro. Wilson being installed first W. M. by Wor. Bro. Tucker who was appointed 1st I.P.M.

The exceptional lines upon which it was intended the Lodge should be conducted were as follows:—

1. Only serving and retired members of the British Army and Navy should be eligible for Initiation or joining
2. That the Office of W. M. should be held alternately by commissioned and non-commissioned Officers, and as far as possible an equal number of each should hold the other Offices.

3. That in choosing the Officers, the Masonic seniority of a brother should be considered as of greater weight than seniority of membership of the Lodge. Thus a zealous brother (who by reason of frequent changes of Station could scarcely hope to obtain the Mastership of a Civil Lodge), might bring into the Lodge and receive due consideration for his previous Masonic Rank.

The reasons advanced for the formation of this Lodge have been amply justified by the results of four years work. Notwithstanding the many difficulties which must occur in having such a floating membership, since its consecration

68 have been initiated, and
113 have joined.

The present membership is 97.

The Lodge is a Life Governor of both the R.M.I. for Girls and R.M.I. for Boys, and has a sum of money invested as a reserve.

It is surely in the fitness of things that the Master's Chair, this year, is filled by W. Bro. Fitzgerald who is so closely associated with the Illustrious Brother whose name the Lodge is permitted to bear.

Bellapais Lodge Farewells

W.Bro. Ken Price, PDJGD, PPrGStB (Wales)

On 26th March this year, Brethren of Bellapais Lodge No. 9847 and their wives gathered together at Morelli's Restaurant near Kyrenia to bid farewell to W.Bro. Ken Price and his wife Marion, prior to their return to the UK. Ken worked hard as a member of the Steering

Committee prior to Consecration, by the District Grand Master, of the Lodge on 24th October 2009. Indeed, he was thrilled to have been Installed as the Founding Master of the Lodge and, since Installing his successor, has assisted in the work of the Lodge as and when required. He is also very well known in the District, having been a regular visitor to most of the Craft Lodges, travelling all over the island of Cyprus from his residence seven miles east of Kyrenia.

Ken has lived in Cyprus for the last eleven years and has enjoyed every minute. "Marion and I have had a great time here." He told The Wire. "We have made some wonderful friends and the beautiful memories will stay with us for as long as we live."
